WHEREAS,	at its October 2006 meeting, the University of North Carolina Board of Governors adopted a four-year plan proposed by UNC General Administration to provide a level of predictability to tuition and fee increases, capping tuition and fee increases to 6.5% per year or lower based on appropriations received by the State of North Carolina; and,		
WHEREAS,	during the two years since this policy was adopted by the Board, particularly within the last six months, the economic climate in the State of North Carolina has deteriorated significantly; and,		
WHEREAS,	as a result of this economic erosion, many North Carolina families are finding it increasingly difficult to continue providing for their children's education in the University while maintaining basic living expenses; and,		
WHEREAS,	at the October 2008 meeting of the Board's Budget & Finance Committee, Vice Chairman <i>Emeritus</i> Craig Souza strongly urged the Committee to consider a 1-year moratorium on tuition increases in light of the financial constraints on North Carolina families; and,		o consider a 1-
WHEREAS,	following similar concerns expressed by Committee member Estelle "Bunny" Sanders, the Budget & Finance Committee issued a statement to the full Board of Governors conveying its sense of concern regarding the economic climate and deferring further action to the Board's November meeting; and,		the full Board of
