A RESOLUTION TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO ENCOURAGE EQUITY IN REGARD TO STATE APPROPRIATED FUNDS

Short Title: State Appropriations Equity Act Sponsored by: President BLACKWELL (corresponding), President BASS First Reading: March 27, 2009 Version Date: March 24, 2009 (Initial Edition) Council of Student Body Presidents Referred to: 1 **WHEREAS**, the issue of equity with state appropriated funds in the UNC system has been 2 addressed several times in the past, but rarely fully addressed and rarely from the 3 students; and, 4 5 **WHEREAS**, the Association understands that it would be very difficult to address this situation 6 in this current economic climate, yet the issue is still important and must remain a 7 top priority and concern; and, 8 9 WHEREAS, we represent the students of the UNC system and each student in this system is a 10 student of the University of North Carolina, and we must agree that no one student 11 is any more or less important than another student; and, 12 13 **WHEREAS**, accordingly, all students in the UNC system that are residents of North Carolina 14 should receive comparable amounts from state appropriated funds; and, 15 16 WHEREAS, students at Appalachian State University, North Carolina Agricultural and 17 Technical State University, the University of North Carolina Charlotte, and the 18 University of North Carolina Wilmington are currently receiving approximately 19 \$9,000 per student in state appropriated funds, while some institutions are 20 currently receiving approximately \$20,000 per student in state appropriated funds; 21 now, therefore, be it 22 23 **RESOLVED**, that the UNC Association of Student Governments, on behalf of the students of 24 the University of North Carolina, encourages the UNC Board of Governors and 25 the North Carolina General Assembly to move towards equity in the way that state 26 appropriated funds are distributed amongst the students of the UNC system, such 27 that at the very minimum no one student receives double what another student is 28 receiving in terms of state appropriated funds; and be it further 29 30 **RESOLVED**, the Association further encourages the UNC Board of Governors and North 31 Carolina General Assembly to address this issue as soon as fiscally possible.
