,) 2 }	RESOLVED	, that the Association urges UNCGA, based on the results of that updated survey, to produce a list of "best practices" that is made available to students and articulates a minimum desired standard of security for each institution; and be it further
, ; ; ;	RESOLVED	, the Student Governments of each constituent institution, upon the production of the updated campus safety document from UNCGA, urge their respective campus administrations to focus their safety efforts around the contents of the report.
